WORKSHOP MUSICAL THEATRE

Slide 1

Teacher presentation - I teach Portuguese at this school and I am the director of the theatre group Serafins for almost thirty years.

Slide 2 e 3

I like theatre very much because it teaches values and develops artistic and communicative skills. **Respect** because we must accept others and their differences. **Humility** because we do not know everything. **Empathy** because we must have the capacity to understand each other. **Responsibility** because the success of others also depends on our work. Finally, **discipline** because we must be able to achieve our goals.

Slide 4

Musical theatre is my specialty because, over the years, I realized that several students had a talent for playing musical instruments, singing and dancing. My daughter is one of the examples I can mention.

In the Serafins Group I write the scripts, I select the songs according to the theme and season of the plays and she makes the choreographies. Sometimes, we work together on the musical selection.

Musical Theatre results from the combination of three artistic areas: Acting, dancing and singing.

Music and dance are essential to express individual or collective feelings and emotions. In our group we try to show the talents of the students in different artistic areas.

The plot is an important part of musical theatre. We can see an emotional story through words, music, movement and visual and sound effects.

In musical theatre there can be tragedy and comedy as in these two examples.

Anger, pain, happiness, enthusiasm can be expressed in this kind of theatre.

We must not forget that musical theatre is typical of Broadway. It cannot survive without: great investment, fabulous scenery, special effects, splendid voices, beautiful costumes, music, great dancers and a lot of glamour.

I'm going to show you three plays where Serafins try to integrate everything I just said.

- > A piece of heaven recreates british imperialism in India in the 19th century
- > Side by side is a story about two worlds: the rich and the poor. I really like this picture: the scenery and Filipa dancing
- **Perlimpimpim** is a play about children's tales/stories.

Another thing: in musical theatre it is possible to make a meeting of generations, in this case students and teachers. I put on stage different generations and it is fantastic.

Coordination on stage is also important and provides a good visual effect but is not easy when there are many people on stage. let's watch one video.

As you all know, hat production gave our city a great projection in the 20th century. We also know that the top hat was the hat of Broadway. The hat is a timeless accessory and can give us great comfort on stage.

I'm going to tell you a story. Joana, is a Serafim. She liked hats. She was a girl scout but also wanted to be a ballerina. When she was 5 years old she got cancer in her leg and stopped dancing. She had a dream to dance for a big audience but she died last year. Covid stopped her dream but we put our plan B into action.

Anticipating the worst, we made a recording a few months before her death. Joana lost her beautiful hair with the treatments. She always said she would never act or dance without her winter hat because it was her friend at all times.
